- ALL donated undecorated panels and 3D items are for the sole use of our charity event. Please refrain from gifting and/or panel swapping them. Our support sponsors work very hard to fabricate and decorate these items for the Chicago Brushmasters/Ronald McDonald House event.
- ALL work spaces are on a daily first come/first served basis. No reserving/saving spots for artists who have not yet arrived. Working next to new artists presents great opportunities for new friendships and new inspiration!
- No paint is to leave the Compound, Auction and Racecar(s)/Special Projects areas.
- **Please keep your work area clean.** If you have garbage, please throw it in a trash can.
- Please keep the paint bench clean and organized. Put paint bottles back in the rack, place the mixing sticks on the wire rack to dry and if a bottle is out of paint, please let us know so that it can be refilled.
- Be aware of your neighbor. Most of us are used to working alone and not thinking
  about another person working on the same easel. When wiping off a panel, please be
  careful not to shake the easel. It's really hard to lay down a nice line when the panel is
  moving.
- Keep food inside the designated food court area.
- **No offensive clothing.** Remember this is a family event. Please wear proper attire.
- No guests are allowed inside the compound. We ask that you kindly visit with your guests, friends and family outside the compound area. These are parameters we were asked to follow and have agreed to in order to keep the compound maintained.
- We ask that if you are attending the show on Sunday that you finish up your painting by 1pm to allow paint to dry. It's very difficult handling wet panels when it's time to pack up the show for the evening.
